

ATC CHECKLIST ADDENDUM

Schedule F – this form must be completed by any applicant that has been convicted of a felony, and seeks lawful issuance of an alcohol beverage permit under the provisions of R.S. 26:80f and/or 26:280f. Applicant attest that the felony was not a crime of violence as defined in R.S. 14:2(13) and that ten or more years have elapsed between the date of application and the successful completion of any sentence, deferred adjudication or period of probation, parole and the final discharge of the defendant. Applicant is required to submit official documentation of such at the time of application.

A crime of violence under R.S. 14:2(13) is any of the following:
